Entry fees shall be refunded only if the competition is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of closing of entries (7000) (B) (1.5) (1) (2).

**Music:**

**Audio cassettes will no longer be accepted.** Each skater or couple will have to provide **two (2) compact disks CDR (and not CD-RW)** at the registration table at least one (1) hour before the beginning of his competition. There must be only one program by disc (on a single track) and it must be engraved in audio mode, mp3 will not be accepted. The name of the competitor, the category as well as the exact duration of the music must be indicated clearly. The discs must be presented in their protective cases. **Clean your discs well** and ensure that it is not scratched in order to avoid any problem of reading. **Results:**

The system "Code by Cumulating Points" will be used to determine the result for all categories. Posting of results will be done with the version produced by CCP : Publication of Results: Following each segment the Total Technical Score, the Program Component Score, the deductions and the Total Segment Score of every competitor must be published.

**Awards:**

Medals will be awarded to the top three places in each event. In the case of only two entries, each entry shall be awarded a medal **(7000) (B) (1.13)**. No medal will be awarded for an exhibition even if it is evaluated.

**Admission:**

At registration, **only** the competitor will receive a pass for the weekend. If the skater loses his pass, he will have to purchase one at the cost of \$ 15. In the dressing rooms, only pre-juvenile skaters will be authorized to have a person accompany them, other than the coach.

**A certified coach according to rules (must have the official photo I.D. card )** will be admitted free **(Compulsory)**.

## TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS:

The skaters must have successfully completed the test to register in the category of their choice with the exception of those who try centralized tests (see lower for the criteria).

The skaters will have the possibility of registering in one segment if he wishes to.

The skaters cannot register in two categories of the same discipline, example: register both in pre-novice ladies free and novice ladies short will not be allowed.

For all categories, the skaters have to be eligible persons according to rules of section 5000 of Skate Canada.

NB. The programs are the official programs of competitions including the changes accepted by Skate Canada after the meeting of the ISU which takes place in June. ## **CENTRALIZED TESTS**

Please take note that it will be possible to try competitive tests during the BMO Quebec Summer Championships.

### Criteria:

- Register in the category in which the skater wants to be tested for;
- The skater can register in no other category of the same discipline (ex: register in the Juvenile ladies category and register in the Pre-novice ladies free for testing will not be permitted).

Competitors shall be under the age of 12 (Ladies) and 13 (Men) as before July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the event.

Men and Ladies : 2 min. 30 sec. +/- 10 sec

PRE-JUVENILE : Completed Preliminary free skating test

Ladies: Shall be under the age of 11 before July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the event.  
Men: Shall be under the age of 12 before July 1<sup>st</sup> preceding the event.

A free skating program to music : Men and Ladies : 2 minutes 30 sec. +/- 10 seconds.

**Pattern dances** (2010-2011) : **European Waltz**, Keats Foxtrot, Harris Tango, Rocker Foxtrot

- According to the dances chosen by Skate Canada for the 2011 Sectional Championships, the dance # 1 will be skated (the dance # 2 will be skated at the Georges-Éthier Memorial Competition).

Free Dance : The requirements for this program are set out in the Technical Manual

Duration : 2 minutes 30 seconds +/- 10 seconds skated to music

JUVENILE as per Skate Canada rules

No age requirement

**Pattern dances** (2010-2011) : Fiesta Tango, Ten-Fox, Fourteenstep, European Waltz

PRE-JUVENILE (A)

Must have passed the complete Preliminary dance test.

**Pattern dances** (2009-2010) : Swing Dance  
(The Fiesta Tango will be skated at the Georges-Éthier Memorial Competition)

Free Dance : Please refer to the Juvenile Dance Well Balanced Program

Duration : Please note : Level of execution of the lift and spin will be no higher than level 1.  
2 minutes +/- 10 seconds skated to music.

PRE-JUVENILE (B)

Must have passed one dance of the Preliminary dance test.

**Pattern dances** : Dutch Waltz, Canasta Tango
